

AGILITY TRIAL SAFETY PROCEDURES

Clark County Events Center

The following set of rules and guidelines were constructed using CDC, Washington State and AKC guidelines for the safety of our officials, volunteers and exhibitors.

As requirements of authorities and/or clubs change in response to new information, then these guidelines may be modified. Please make sure you download the latest version so you know what to expect on your trial day.

Participants must be responsible for their personal hygiene and health. **If you are not feeling well, please stay home.**

Vaccinated people no longer need to wear a mask or physically distance. We are leaving it to you to make the best choices for yourselves. We will no longer be doing check in at the doors. You may enter and exit through all the doors. We will also be able to sit in the bleachers and spectate.

We will be keeping with some other protocol items like only the next 3 dogs and handlers may be in the center area to the rings. No seating or videoing from that center area will be allowed. This has proven to be very good for the dogs by keeping that area less congested.

Hand sanitizing stations will still be made available inside the Arena building. You may enter and exit through any of the doors. Face masks are not required for vaccinated people.

Spectators and Vendors are now allowed at these trials.

Additional items are listed below:

1. Course Maps will **not** be printed for exhibitors
 - Course maps will be posted in multiple locations for exhibitors to take a photo
 - We will also email course maps each night after 6pm for the next day.
 - We will be using the Agility Gate app and maps should also be posted there.
2. Center Ring
 - Sanitation stations will be provided at strategic locations with hand sanitizer and cleaning supplies
 - No spectator chairs allowed in the center area between the rings.
 - The Agility Gate App will be used at these trials. Please check in using this free app. Additional info regarding this app will be sent with trial confirmation letters. The Gate Steward will check you in if you have not been able to use the app. You can follow the ring progress on the App to help you know when to come into the ring.

3. Award area
 - Results will be posted on a wall/fence or other easily accessible location – participants may take a photo of their results.
 - Ribbons will be available for pickup in the designated award area.
 - A hanging pocket organizer will be mounted in the award area where your results sticker will be placed. Each exhibitor will have their own designated pocket with your name on it. Take your sticker at your convenience.

4. Walk-Thrus
 - To avoid crowding we will stay with the smaller walk thru groups of no more than 20 exhibitors in the ring at a time.

5. Running the Course
 - Only the next THREE teams to run will be allowed in the CENTER area.
 - #1 is in the ring
 - #2 is at the in-gate
 - #3 is at the next social distance marker
 - #4 is just outside center area ready to come in
 - LEASH - exhibitor can choose to carry the leash in their pocket, but it must fit fully inside the pocket. It is also allowed for the exhibitor to “wear” the leash around your waist or crossbody. Note that should the dog take hold of the leash at any time while on the course, the result will be an “E”.

6. Hospitality
 - The Fairgrounds had now has a food vendor. Check the info from each individual trial for current information on food availability.
 - MACH/PACH cakes are now allowed.
